

# GREAT SEATS AVAILABLE Multiple sofa groupings make immense room manageable

's great rooms can be so large that sofas and accompanying chairs get lost in them. So many homeowners, such as Barbara and Mike McLean of Phoenix, are turning to an alternative solution: Creating numerous seating areas. The resulting look is less formal and more like the casual, inviting feel of a resort lobby. Look to the one at the Arizona Biltmore Resort & Spa, which offers a variety of seating choices, as a case in point.

"When you have such a grandly scaled space, it creates a more intimate environment," said Lindsey Schultz, designer with Ownby Design in Scottsdale. She worked with the McLeans in decorating their 5,000-square-foot hillside home.

The couple's great room, eight steps down from the entry, gives new meaning to the word "great." It features soaring 20-foot, pine-planked ceilings, original to the house, and floor-to-ceiling windows along the west and south walls that offer grand views of the hillside, desert vegetation, wildlife and the city. Along the north wall, the massive fireplace, another original feature, commands attention with stone face, mantel and hearth. On the east side, a half wall separates the great room from the dining room, which is on the same level as the foyer.

Before Schultz redesigned the space, the couple

found it difficult to decorate.

Unlike most living areas, it did not have typical walls, which help facilitate furniture placement, Barbara McLean said. Instead, she and her husband faced a dilemma: Whether to obstruct the views by

putting furniture against the windows or whether to center the seating areas around the fireplace.

"If you did that, you can't look out the windows," Barbara said. It also meant that during parties, guests had nowhere to sit but on the fireplace hearth when conversing.

Several smaller seating areas - in front of the fireplace, by the west window and in the southwest corner - solve the problems.

The fireplace still serves as a focal point, but it doesn't overtake the room. It's an ideal spot for relaxing.

Two matching sofas, upholstered in taupe mohair and accented with dark-blue pillows, face each


other in front of the fireplace. A set of three geometric tables, crafted of copper, can be moved together to form a larger coffee table. Set apart, they serve as individual side tables.

A third sofa, set back-to-back with a sofa in the fireplace arrangement, forms a second conversation area; it's paired with two chairs in a woven, light-taupe fabric. A modern lamp of repeating square shapes graces the side table, also made of copper.

The round table in the southwest

The round table in the southwest corner is perfect for enjoying drinks at dusk: It offers great views of the sunset and city lights.

A display unit, made of contrasting dark and reddish-stained wood, serves as a divider between the corner seating area and the Yamaha baby grand piano, which lends a classic feel. The divider showcases the couple's collection of horse sculptures and hides the stereo equipment. Throughout the room, plants — anthurium ruffles, raphis palms and dracaena arborea —

dividual tables or as seating.

The room has a casual yet upscale look with clean lines and a palette of taupes with accents of deep blue. Schultz kept colors neutral so that the room didn't feel too full. The soft shades also have a calming feel and don't detract from the landscape, which features paloverde trees. The blue accents work well with the hints of orange found in the stone of the fireplace and in the woods in the room, Schultz said. They carry out the blue theme found throughout the rest of the house, which features antiques mixed in with casual contemporary styling.

The McLeans are pleased with the room's tranquil, inviting look and have a hard time agreeing on their favorite spot.

"Instead of being focused on the fireplace, we're focused on the whole room," Mike McLean said.
